


Children's Ministry with Bridget

Worship Ministries

Psalm 100:1 says "Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth. Worship the Lord with gladness; come into his presence with singing." This verse highlights the importance of music and singing as integral parts of worshipping God, a tradition that has been carried forward from the church's beginning.

From the earliest days of the church, singing has been at the heart of faith, with early Christians gathering to sing hymns and psalms as expressions of prayer. As Christianity evolved, choirs became central to worship, with monks chanting in stone chapels and choirs leading hymns in diverse languages and styles. While the music has changed, the purpose has not: to draw us closer to God through beauty, unity, and praise.

In our church today, the choir is not simply performing for the congregation – they are worship leaders. Through their voices, they help all of us find a deeper

connection with God. Every anthem, every harmony, every quiet moment of preparation is an act of devotion. Their ministry reminds us that worship is something we do together – with heart, mind, and voice.

In a fast-moving world, the choir invites us to pause and listen deeply. Their music reminds us that worship is not only spoken or read but sung – lifted up and shared. It's a living prayer that carries the faith of our community week after week.

When you next hear the choir, consider how their voices, rehearsed diligently, contribute to a collective worship experience that transcends individual efforts. And if you've ever felt that tug to sing, perhaps it's the Spirit inviting you to join in. After all, the choir has always been, and will always be, one of the church's most beautiful ways to pray.
