










Ride the bus to the bishop's installation in Oil City:



Worship Ministries



Candles play an important part of our liturgical celebrations. Lutheran churches often use candles to symbolize God's presence or to represent Jesus Christ, the Light of the World. We see candles in Advent wreaths, on the altar, during Easter season, at baptisms and at funerals. Votive candles are lit for private prayers or in memory of loved ones. Burning candles in church is an ancient tradition providing a spiritual

continuity with previous generation's faith practices.

Altar candles were originally a practical way of providing light for the priest who was leading communion. Some Lutheran churches use a Sanctuary Lamp or Eternal Flame as a sign of the eternal or constant presence of the Holy Spirit. During Easter season, the Paschal Candle used to be burned throughout all 50 days of the season. Which is why it's so big! The Paschal Candle is also lighted for baptisms and funeral services. Both times it's a symbol of Christ's death and resurrection.

Four blue or purple candles are placed in a circular wreath counting down the weeks of Advent leading

up to Christmas Day. A white Christ's Candle is sometimes placed in the center of the wreath and lit on Christmas Day. This represents the arrival of "the light that shines in the darkness." Personal candles for Christmas Eve services, Easter vigil services and Pentecost services visually symbolize the distribution of the Light of Christ throughout the congregation.

Candles are symbols of the Light, of faith and of hope in darkness; reminding us God is always present to guide and enlighten us on our spiritual journey.
